Keswick and Intwood Parish Council Meeting on the 29th of November 2023. Minutes of the Meeting held at the Reading Room, Keswick at 19:00.

Present: Janet Hill (JH) (Chair); David Vail (DV); Marguerite Russell (MR); Mike Pilgrim (MP); Monica Warmerdam (MW) and Suzannah Billington (SB).

Also present: Samantha Henry (Clerk); David Bills (County Councillor); Deborah Sacks (District Councillor) and 4 members of the public were in attendance.

Apologies were received from: no apologies had been received. District Councillor Daniel Elmer was not present.

2023/53. To consider apologies for absence: N/A.

2023/54. Declarations of Interest: a) in accordance with s.31 of the Localism Act 2011, Members to declare any Disclosable Pecuniary Interests in items on this Agenda; and b) the Clerk to report any written requests for dispensation in respect of items on this Agenda: Councillor Billington declared planning application 2023/3477 as a pecuniary interest.

2023/55. To confirm the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on the 27th September 2023: The minutes were confirmed as an accurate record and signed by the Chair.

2023/56. To report matters arising from the minutes not on the agenda for information only:

 Item 2023/48 – D-Day celebrations in 2024. This would be added to the February agenda for further discussion.

2023/57. Public Participation:

 Resolution to adjourn the meeting for public participation and any County and District Councillor reports:

County Councillor Bills gave the following update regarding the recent flooding issues that had affected the parish:

- National Highways had given Orsted permission to use the attenuation ponds beneath the bridge. Norfolk County Council (NCC) had requested full planning documentation and maintenance plans for the ponds, to establish whether they were suitable for use.
- A meeting had taken place today between NCC Highways department, NCC Flooding department and South Norfolk District Council (SNDC) planning department to discuss the issue. The development had now been made a flood investigation site. A report was awaited from the local flood authority.
- The Environmental Manager at Orsted had requested a meeting with NCC Highways.
- JH highlighted that Orsted's code of construction practice, which clearly detailed the requirements relating to waste disposal, had not appeared to be followed, with several instances of water and mud being disposed of at the entrance to the site and

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directly onto B1113, which had been witnessed by Councillors and parishioners. DB explained that NCC had raised this with the developer, to which they had replied assuring the Council they had adhered to the code of practice. JH enquired about sanctions that would be imposed upon the developers in light of the issues being discussed.

- DS agreed to send the Parish Council the latest correspondence received from the planning officers at SNDC.

- DS informed Councillors that a meeting would be held at SNDC on the 30th
 November 2023 to further discuss the issue.
- DS asked Councillors to record any further incidents witnessed. DS would be liaising with the Flood agency and would keep the Parish Council informed of any updates.
- JH highlighted that the flooding issue would be increased in subsequent years with the development of Keswick Industrial Estate.
- MW suggested that the Parish Council should be working in conjunction with surrounding villages to monitor and photograph the breaches that have occurred relating to the Orsted development. The Clerk agreed to contact Swardeston Parish Council to discuss the issue.

 ACTION CLERK
- DV raised concerns regarding the original plans for the drainage of the development. He theorised that if the plans had been deemed sufficient and the developers had adhered to the plans, this would mean that the design was not fit for purpose. If that was the case this could mean further issues for the County, with developments potentially being given the green light with inadequate drainage requirements in place. DB informed the meeting that all evidence had been sent to the local flood authority for further investigation.
- MP raised concerns regarding the cumulative effect of the developments and the flood risk that would ensue, suggesting that the Parish Council should contact the flood authority directly to highlight the matter.

2023/58. To discuss recent flooding of the B1113 and a review of local drainage: this was discussed under item 2023/57, during the public participation portion of the meeting.

2023/59. To discuss pedestrian access to Keswick Hall from Low Road: Parishioners raised their concerns regarding the danger that the roads to Keswick Hall presented for pedestrians, particularly in the winter months when there was no lighting. Parishioners also shared their concerns regarding the trees along the roadside. District Councillor Sacks agreed to investigate the ownership of the trees. JH enquired with DB about having a footpath from Low Road to Keswick Hall, along Keswick Hall Road. DB would pass on the details of the engineer at Highways NCC who could be contacted. The Clerk agreed to contact Highways to explain the issue in order to see if a feasibility study would be possible. **ACTION DB/CLERK**
